CONSENT ORDER

Petitioner.

The State of Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department") has received evidence that **Weston Farnes** ("Farnes" or "Petitioner") violated provisions of Title 20, Arizona Revised Statutes. Petitioner wishes to resolve this matter without the commencement of formal proceedings, admits the following Findings of Fact are true, and consents to entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- Farnes is not licensed with the Department as an adjuster, nor is he exempt from the licensing requirement for adjusters.
- 2. Farnes' address is c/o True-Built Construction, LLC, 6317 South Banning Street, Gilbert, Arizona 85298.
- 3. On February 22, 2010, Farnes faxed an "Authorization" to Liberty Mutual Insurance Company ("Liberty") regarding Claim # 016918023-01, which was signed by the insured and authorized Farnes to "contact my insurer for the sole purpose of negotiating with Liberty on my behalf to obtain full reimbursement under the terms of my policy for a property damage claim arising from a storm . . . that caused irreparable damage to the roof and air conditioning unit of the Insured's residence."
- 4. On or about April 28, 2011, the Department issued an Order To Cease And Desist ("Order") ordering Farnes to immediately cease and desist from unlawfully acting as or claiming to be an adjuster.
 - 5. On or about May 20, 2011, Farnes timely appealed the Order.

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CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 6. An adjuster is defined as any person who for compensation, fee or commission either adjusts, investigates or negotiates settlement of claims arising under insurance contracts on behalf of the insured or holds oneself out to perform those services, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-321(A).
- 7. Petitioner is not exempt from the licensing requirement, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-321(B).
- 8. Petitioner's conduct, although unintentional, constitutes acting as or claiming to be an adjuster without being licensed as an adjuster, in violation of A.R.S. § 20-321.01(A).
- 9. Grounds exist to issue a cease and desist order to Petitioner for acting as or claiming to be an adjuster without being licensed, within the meaning of A.R.S. § 20-292 as applied to adjusters under A.R.S. § 20-321.02.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

- 1. Petitioner shall immediately cease and desist from unlawfully acting as or claiming to be an adjuster.
 - 2. The hearing in this matter scheduled for August 16, 2011, is vacated.

- 6. Petitioner acknowledges that this Consent Order is an administrative action that the Department will report to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). Petitioner further acknowledges that he must report this administrative action to any and all states in which he holds an insurance license and must disclose this administrative action on any license application.
